- Digital forum for researchers and RECs in the social and economic sciences
- RatSWD working papers (since 2008) and consultation process (2015-17)
- Focus: ethical reflexivity and ethics reviews
- Workshops to build capacities (e.g. on ethical research data managment)
- Stakeholder consultation to generate recommendations for ethics reviews, e.g. on
 - Research with ai, participatory research, research without informed consent, further topics (suggested by users)
- Proposal to be submitted to DFG (by RatSWD, WZB, LMU)
